The season proper had a later start than usual due to our city hosting the Australian Masters Games. ## JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT MANAGER'S REPORT

Although our results with the win-loss ratios in the table below do not show it, we have continued to build on our Junior Program initiatives from the years prior with lots of positives coming from this season.

The key standout for me this season was the uptake of players into the Charter program as detailed further into the report. For the first time since the Charter boundaries were established, Glenelg was rezoned into the Southern Charter League - Sea Hawks, moving away from the Rays Charter. This then brought together teams from Glenelg, Sturt, Goodwood and Southern Districts.

At the end of the regular 22/23 season Craig Handy, Luke Thompson and Tim Day introduced the inaugural Winter Development program. The intent of this program was to provide our juniors with an opportunity to hit the ground running when spring training came around. This was then intended to have the participants game ready come Round 1. Our coaching staff provided two-weekly training sessions with expert support in many areas including Pitching, Catching, Infield and Outfield, as well the batting box. Thank you, gentlemen, for your help and support in this space.



Andrew Qualmann and Tim Day also provided pitching and catching support after Thursday training sessions where this level of refinement was not afforded during regular training sessions. Thank you all for your support in developing our Juniors. It is greatly appreciated.

Without the support from West Torrens this year in the Junior League space, we would not have been able to successfully field a team each week without a collective pull of players from the Little League team with only 7 players registered. Each week West Torrens provided between 2 and 3 players as they were in surplus on their end. This then gave both clubs the ability to play ball each week without players missing out from West Torrens (being rostered off) or from Glenelg (from not being able to field a team). This was clearly a win-win in the players' space from both clubs involved and I thank Mark Stevens and his team for their continued support. There players were a fantastic bunch of individuals.

The coaching staff and I are very proud of our group, we all felt that there were many improvements and still some left in the tank, which is the way to go. A lovely season was had by all, and especially enjoyed by the coach. This was my first year coaching a GBC cohort of any sort. I thoroughly enjoyed the experience, both during training, in the lead up to games and of course enjoying the spoils of our efforts on game day. We were very competitive in both our wins and our losses. I was proud of how the team came together week in week out and how competitive we were on game day given our varying degrees of skill. I was particularly impressed with how effective our at bats were across the season. In years gone by, the U11's cohort have been guilty of closing their eyes and hoping for a miracle when it came to batting, or quite often swinging at junk balls. This season we saw batting with purpose where bats remained on the shoulder when pitches were outside our swing zone, but more importantly, when the bats were swung when the ball was within it. Often, we made effective contact. The table below gives us an idea of how effective our plate appearances were. Unfortunately, not all these plate appearances and on-base percentages converted to runs, meaning we were inconsistent at bat from player to player, and as I found out, from week to week ②.

In Minor League, it's an opportunity for coaches to rotate players through all positions to help develop them as players, but also to see from a coaching standpoint, where players fit. I feel this was achieved giving players a taste of most positions. With pitcher development key to the success of a baseball team, I was able to rotate 9 of our 12 team members through this position, whilst all our players were able to rotate through each of the other key positions.

There were times where our attention span out in the field was what you would expect of 8- and 9-yearolds where butterflies and airplanes were key interest points, but when push came to shove, plays were made, and outs were given.

2023/2024 the best Pee Wee season yet. Here is to 2024/25. Thanks for the opportunity to be a part of their journey.




